UUCF Religious Education Report July 13th 2021 Board Meeting

Religious Education on Sundays:

We have concluded our weekly RE children's RE classes on Zoom. Attendance was steadily declining as we entered summer and as all of the children, parents and teachers became, understandably, "zoomed out."

We have developed a plan for the summer that would incorporate some in-person elements (see below for the proposal/plan).

R.E. Committee and Teen/Family Engagement:

The RE Committee continues to meet every month to keep the momentum going with regard to volunteer action and regular opportunities for family engagement. We have regular, monthly activities for families, all organized by the RE Committee and parent volunteers. These activities include: the drive by food drive, planned family zoom activity, and parent "time out" zoom get together.

Aside from working toward engagement, the RE Committee has been looking ahead to build a strong framework not only for when we return in person, but moving forward. The committee has outlined a foundation for RE Curriculum which outlines the goals or focus for each age group each year. These goals would be on a 3 year cycle (i.e. OWL, Coming of Age, and World Religions for younger HS or Junior High, etc.). In conjunction with the curriculum, the committee is putting together a curriculum calendar to ensure that we stay on track. (see below for outline).

We are also discussing the logistics and planning for returning to in-person church and what that means for R.E.

Additionally, the RE 8th principle workshop taskforce is planning the 8th Principle Workshop for families. The plan is for this to take place sometime in late August for our families (and any congregants who wish to join) as an introduction to and education about the 8th principle as well as covenanting as an RE community to affirm and hold ourselves accountable to living the 8th principle.

We have had scheduling conflicts over the last few weeks when it comes to our planning meetings. I am hopeful that we can get back on track with those. Otherwise, it appears that the workshop may need to be pushed back. Thus far, the taskforce has identified the desired goals/outcomes for the workshop and outlined both a part 1 and part 2 session. We are next working on gathering resources and speakers/facilitators to assist with the conversation. The taskforce includes: Sophia Ventura-Cruess, Carter Rakowski, Katrina Gomez-Enriquez, Hilary Key, and myself.

Other:

The R.E. Teachers and I have begun to consolidate the boxes in the Chapman lounge. We will be going to First Christian every Sunday to work on the R.E. boxs, plan the year, and do the summer activities. I will be inviting R.E.Committee members who have offered their help to come in to assist in this process. The goal is to have it all taken care over by mid-August.
